And in fifth place Jim Barbour, 125, 140. Well up too was Oliver Cock, 7th with 133, 148. The Ladies' Event was won deservedly by Heather Meakin with 433, (100, 123). For Heather has been winning steadily during the season, and justifiably the honour of the National Event has at last been hor reward. But her rival Mary Farrant (102.C) was not far behind, capsizing on the fall on her first run. Third was Joan Millard (125, 150). In the Team Event, first place went to the British A (Farrant, Goodman. Bill Crockett) with 776. Second was the B team (Barbour, Horsman, Ron Crockett) with 850, and the Royal CC (Lucas, Pegram, Taylor) third, 940.
