

First was Paul Farrant with 213 points, which included a 50. It is proposed only to give the results as percentages of the winner's best times and as this year both results may count towards the Ranking List, both runs will be given. Paul's two runs therefore were 100, 163. Second was Bill Goodman, with two very useful scores indeed, 110, 112 and third was Keith White, 113, 122. Keith on his second run was awarded a 20 on Gate 4, when it seemed quite clear from independent witnesses that he had in fact scored 50. Keith too was quite certain that he had scored a 50, and insisted that it be altered to a 50, a sporting gesture which cost him first place. It is pleasing to be assured that our members think more of the sport than of "Pot Hunting". Fourth was Dave Campbell of Scotland, 117, 120, with Bill Horsman fifth at 122, 127.

Whilst we normally only give the scores for the first five, we feel that Mike Ingham at 6th, with 123, 136, and Geoff Boyson at 10th, 143, 174, deserve mention. This is their first real year in Slalom.
